Douglas Galyon Depot ● Visit the Greensboro History Museum ● Tour the Blandwood Mansion ● Visit the Colonial Heritage Center on New Garden Road ● Visit the Guilford National Military Park (include a viewing of the movie at the Visitors Center) ● Take a tour of First National Bank Field (Grasshoppers Stadium) ● Attend an event sponsored by the Piedmont Triad Regional Council ● Attend a SynerG or Action Greensboro event.

### **Education & Human Services**

Schedule a tour of any of the institutions of higher education located in Greensboro (North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, Bennett College, Greensboro College, Guilford College, Elon University School of Law) • Volunteer at a Guilford County school (read in a classroom, volunteer as a testing proctor) • Walk the Downtown Greenway • Attend the Guilford Education Alliance's Education Summit • Tour the Union Square campus • Serve as a Community Reader Day volunteer for Guilford Education Alliance.

### **Diversity & Inclusion**

Tour one of Greensboro's local HBCUs, North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University or Bennett College • Take a guided tour of the International Civil Rights Center & Museum • Take the Underground Railroad tour of the Guilford College Woods • Attend a religious service at a place of worship in Greensboro that is different from your faith tradition • Dine at an Ethnosh event • Attend a meeting of the Mayor's Committee for Persons with Disabilities • Attend the Guilford Native American Association Annual Pow-Wow & Cultural Festival (3802 Jaycee Park Drive, 9/13-9/15) • Volunteer at the Center for New North Carolinians • Attend a Wise Woman Wednesday Series event • Attend the Guilford Green Foundation or other GGF events • Visit the Register of Deeds and ask to review the slave deeds recorded in Guilford County • Attend a Casa Azul event or program • Attend the North Carolina Folk Festival (9/6-9/8)
