Schedule a tour of any of the institutions of higher education located in Greensboro (North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, Bennett College, Greensboro College, Guilford College, Elon University School of Law) • Volunteer at a Guilford County school (read in a classroom, volunteer as a testing proctor) • Walk the Downtown Greenway • Attend the Guilford Education Alliance Education Summit • Tour the Union Square campus • Serve as a Community Reader Day volunteer for Guilford Education Alliance •
